Lehigh County BOARD OF SUPERVISORS October 5, 2017 Workshop Meeting MINUTES

Present: Chair Donna Wright, Vice-Chair Michael Snovitch, Supervisor John Quigley, Ellen Koplin, Township Manager and one member of the public.

The meeting was convened at 7:31 pm by Chair Wright.

No public comments were received.

The Southwestern Lehigh County Comprehensive Plan is finalized and a public hearing of the elected officials from the six municipalities involved in the multi-municipal plan was held on Monday, September 25, 2017. As required by the PA Municipalities Planning Code, the Comprehensive Plan is adopted by Resolution and the Inter-Municipal Implementation Agreement is adopted by Ordinance.

Motion by Snovitch, seconded by Quigley, to prepare and advertise an Ordinance for the adoption of the Inter-Municipal Implementation Agreement. Quigley asked if the plan may be revised if needed and was assured that it can be. Wright suggested that Quigley consider serving as the steering committee representative for Lower Milford going forward. Unanimous

Motion by Quigley, seconded by Snovitch, to prepare a Resolution for the adoption of the Southwestern Lehigh Comprehensive Plan. Unanimous

Motion by Snovitch, seconded by Quigley, to approve Macungie Borough's request for Lower Milford Fire Police Assistance. Unanimous.

The notice received from Lehigh County of the Act 319 applications in Lower Milford was announced.

No other public comments were received.

Quigley asked for an update on the October Lights Fest. Koplin responded that a meeting took place between the Company, State Police Station Commander, Fire Company personnel and the Township. The company has agreed to many more safety precautions and was advised of the danger posed to travelers on the Northeast Extension of the Pennsylvania Turnpike-Route 476

On motion by Quigley, seconded by Snovitch and unanimously approved, the meeting adjourned at 7:53 PM.
