No Nonsense NEUTERING





The Township is excited to be able to continue offering the TNR (Trap-Neuter-Release) Program through 2024. This program helps control the free-roaming cat population by providing neutering/spaying surgeries and vaccines to feral cats before they are returned home.

New this year, we are contracted solely with No Nonsense Neutering (NNN). NNN has provided the Township with a set number of vouchers that residents can pick up at the Township building during regular business hours. These vouchers are available to residents on a first come, first served basis. However, residents MUST schedule their appointment(s) with NNN before they can receive any voucher(s). Residents will be required to state the date and time of their appointment(s) with the Township when picking up the vouchers.

Auch Fire Prevention

With Spring right around the corner, residents will start to clean up their properties and begin to mulch flower beds and other areas in their yards; but did you know the risk that comes with using mulch? Read on to learn the common causes of mulch fires and ways that you can prevent them:

Common Causes:

- Careless smoking is just that and is a danger when lit cigarettes are discarded into mulch
- Spontaneous combustion can occur when the mulch is too deep (more than a few inches). During high temperatures with no rain, the mulch will dry, heat up from underneath and can spontaneously ignite.
- When old extension cords crack due to weather and can spark as a result.
- When recently used power tools, such as a weed wacker, is set down in the mulch, the heat from the muffler could easily start a fire.

Prevention:

- Don't smoke or allow others to smoke in mulch areas. Discard cigarette butts properly.
- During hot, dry spells, water your mulch bed early in the morning or late in the evening to prevent rapid water evaporation.
- Check lighting and extension cords regularly.
- When operating power yard equipment, be aware of where you set them down to cool off.

The three things you need to start a fire is fuel (in this case, the mulch), oxygen and a heat source. What makes mulch fires very difficult to extinguish is that the fire can travel underneath the mulch—you will see it burning in one spot and another fire could suddenly pop up multiple feet away.

In the event of any fire,:

- Call 911! If someone is with you, have them call 911 and begin to spray the area on fire, if a hose is accessible.
- Use a rake or shovel and pull the involved mulch away from the fire. You are trying to make a ring around the fire down to the dirt, approximately 12-18 inches wide.
 - Soak the area inside the circle while mixing it to ensure you extinguish all of the fire.
 - Watch the area to make sure that no additional flare ups occur.


